From the Management

<u>Reminder:</u> Please DO NOT put your garbage bag by the curb without putting the bag into a can with a lid. We've had vultures, crows, and rats get into these bags by the curb in the past and your neighbors are complaining!

<u>Emergency contact information</u> – Please ensure your emergency contact information listed in the office has current phone numbers and names. Forms are on the back table in the clubhouse and available in the office.

During the office hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, the double glass doors are unlocked. All doors in the clubhouse lock behind you automatically after 4:00 p.m. when the clubhouse doors are locked by the staff. At all times, you will need your key to access the doors on the pool deck that lead to the restrooms.

Rentals / FSBO – Background checks are required for all prospective homeowners AND renters. Per the prospectuses in the park, homeowners that sell their home "by owner" or rent their home must have the prospective buyers or renters approved by park management before contracts are signed. Renters must be registered with the office. Forms are available in the office for this purpose. Please call the office if you have questions about this policy.

Home Resale's – Our resale homes are listed on the Mobile Home Village website! If you've been thinking of buying or selling a home in the park, now is the time! Make that change you've been talking about! We offer a referral fee to those owners that refer friends and family that results in the purchase of one of our listed properties. Resale information is posted on the bulletin board outside our office; handouts/flyers are available in the office. We have office hours Monday through Friday and are on site and available after hours by appointment if you would like to see one of our listings or to sell your home.

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HOT SCOOP FROM THE OFFICE

Hello ALL,

I would like to address a couple of things, some for the now and some for the very near future.

RENTS:

By the end of this year we are getting a new computer system that should allow you to pay your rent online if you like that option, I will keep you posted as we get closer to the date.

Having said that, RENT is due on the 1st, and a grace period until the 5th and is considered late on the 6th. There is a \$15.00 penalty fee that applies at this point.

Once we switch to the new system we will not be allowed to remove the late fee's as we can at this point depending on the circumstance.

If you mail your rent and it is post dated prior to the 5th you will not be charged a late fee.

Home Titles and Drivers license's:

In the office we are doing a file Audit and we will need copies of your home titles and your current Identification, this can be a state issued ID or drivers license. As many we have on file are expired.

Why do we need copies of your home titles you may ask?

The State of Florida Audits Mobile home communities at random and it is required for us to have a copy so that the lease matches the homeowner.

MOWING:

Lawns are mowed every Friday at this point in time. One week they edge the other they weed eat. If your car is in your driveway they will not blow off the driveway because they don't want to damage your car.

If there are any issues with the mowing, DO NOT confront the mowing crew, but come directly to the Office.

You are responsible for pulling your own weeds. If you are unable to do so we do have some references at the office.

POOL PASSES:

Pool passes can be picked up at the office during our business hours. They can be kept for 2 weeks at a time and we change colors every month
