It doesn't get said enough, we have the greatest neighbors here at Veranda Springs, always ready to jump in and lend a helping hand.





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#### **Social Committee News**



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#### Purpose of the Veranda Springs Social Committee

The Social Committee's purpose is to help provide and/or assist with activities that offer fellowship, fun, and enjoyment to all who wish to participate. The cost of these events is to cover expenses, with any excess going to the HOA to help defray expenses of the HOA. Any HOA member is welcome to host; just discuss it with any of the social committee members listed below.

Hosting an event requires responsibility and work but NO cost other than purchasing your own tickets just like everyone else in the past. The host is responsible for planning, finding help, planning a flier (hand delivered fliers are not necessary) and getting tickets from Susan Fullum. Hosts <u>sell tickets at coffee on Thursday mornings for Three weeks prior to the event</u>. Decorations for the event, and purchasing all items including food (*other than those provided by the HOA*) necessary for the event can be purchased with the money collected from tickets sales. It is not necessary for the hosts to pay anything for the decorations out of their own pocket. (Check with Pam or Cindy to learn what decorations are left from previous events.) Keep all receipts for items purchased for the event as they must be turned in with the final report. (*If you are purchasing items for yourself, please have them on a separate receipt for yourself*). The other main duty is setting up and cleaning up the kitchen and hall immediately after or within 24 hours of the event. More detailed instructions will be given when you get the date and approval for the event. <u>All money, receipts and forms are then returned to the social committee hopefully within 48 hours of the event.</u>

The committee is not responsible to host all of the events! We are here to help and assist any volunteering host with anything they need for the event. Feel free to talk to any one of us with event ideas or offers to host or help with an event. Help is always appreciated.


