During the office hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, the double glass doors are unlocked. All doors in the clubhouse lock behind you automatically after 4:00 p.m. when the clubhouse doors are locked by the staff. At all times, you will need your key to access the doors on the pool deck that lead to the restrooms.

<u>Rentals/FSBO – Background checks are required for all</u> <u>prospective homeowners AND renters.</u> Per the prospectuses in the park, homeowners that sell their home "by owner" or rent their home must have the prospective buyers or renters approved by park management before contracts are signed. Renters must be registered with the office. Forms are available in the office for this purpose. Please call the office if you have questions about this policy.

<u>Home Resale's</u> – Our resale homes are listed on the Mobile Home Village website!! If you've been thinking of buying or selling a home in the park, now is the time! Make that change you've been talking about! We offer a referral fee to those owners that refer friends and family that results in the purchase of one of our listed properties. Resale information is posted on the bulletin board outside our office; handouts/flyers are available in the office. We have office hours Monday through Friday and are onsite and available after hours by appointment if you would like to see one of our listings or to sell your home. 


Message From the Editor


Craft Show, Bake Sale & Grill


